



## Charlize Theron thinks women's power is in their "sexuality"

The 'Huntsman: Winter's War' actress can't understand why the "beauty world" is focused on younger females as they often don't find their "strength" until they are older and more secure in themselves. She said: "Women find their strength and power in their sexuality, in their sensuality within, through getting older and being secure within that. "It's ironic that we've built the beauty world around 20 year olds when they have no concept about wisdom, what life is about, having a few relationships under their belt and feeling hardships, to grow into their skin and feel confident within themselves and to feel the value of who they are, not because of a man or because of something like that.
