



Salma Hayek was anxious about meeting the Pope


The 49-year-old actress was recently honored by Pope Francis at a ceremony in the Vatican City, but has revealed she feared His Holiness would withdraw her medal after she had posted a picture of herself staring at Susan Sarandon's chest on the photo-sharing website. The famously curvaceous star said: "I was very honored and excited to be receiving a medal from him. "But I was really nervous because I had just posted an Instagram of me staring at Susan Sarandon's boobs and I was so afraid he would see that picture and take away my medal!" Kanye West has no regrets about his social media posts



Justin Bieber is releasing his own emoji app

The 22-year-old singer followed in the footsteps of stars including Kim Kardashian West and Amber Rose when he launched a range of the messaging graphic symbols on Friday. Justin teased fans by posting a sneak peek on Instagram with the caption: "Friday @AppStore (sic)." Emojis have proved to be extremely successful for celebrities and Amber reportedly made \$2 million on the opening day of her range. The 32-year-old star debuted her MuvaMojis, a set of 900 symbols available from Apple and Android app stores in March and is said to be set to receive a cut of the profits after the successful start. Sources close to the fashion designer said Amber has already made \$4 million out of the app after signing a deal with developer Appmoji. And Kim's are said to make her \$1 million a minute. According to reports, the \$1.99 app was getting downloaded at a rate of 9,000 times per millisecond on its first day.
