Corey Feldman arrested for marijuana possession

The 46-year-old actor was charged with one count of possession of marijuana and a traffic charge after being arrested by officers from the Mangham Police Department in Louisiana on Saturday. Mangham Police Chief Perry Fleming told The News-Star that Corey will have to pay a fine and he was released after being charged. Richland Parish Sheriff Gary Gilley said that some other people in Corey's entourage are facing other

charges and were booked into the Richland Parish Jail for the night. Corey was due to perform at the Live Oaks Bar and Ballroom in Monroe as part of his 'Heavenly US Angelic Tour' but the performance was axed. However, he took part in a meet and greet with fans at the venue. A message on the Live Oaks' Facebook page stated: "Due to unforeseen circumstances, the Corey Feldman show has been canceled. We would

like to apologize for the cancellation. He will still be coming to hangout and it's totally free.. share this post please guys!! (sic)." Meanwhile, Corey recently announced that he plans to "shed some light" on sexual harassment scandals in the wake of the allegations made against Harvey Weinstein. The former child star has previously claimed he was sexually abused by an unnamed Hollywood producer as a teenager, and in a

lengthy rant on Twitter, he insisted he is working on a way to seek "actual justice" after having his career "shut down" by those who didn't believe him. Whilst 'The Goonies' actor has still yet to name the producer who he claims harassed him, he has said he's "glad" people are coming forward to shame 65-year-old Harvey Weinstein, who stands accused of sexually harassing over 40 women in a 30-year period.



Paloma Faith raising her child as gender neutral

The 36-year-old singer and her French boyfriend Leyman Lahcine welcomed their first child in December and Paloma has revealed that they want the tot to just "be who they want to be". She told the Sunday Mirror: "I'm loving being a mum. I want two or three kids in all and they'll be gender neutral. I just want them to be who they want to be." Paloma is not the only star to raise their child as gender neutral; last year

Russell Brand revealed that he and his wife Laura Gallacher refuse to impose a gender identity on their daughter Mabel. Speaking before the tot was born, he said: "We don't know the gender. I may not even impose a gender upon it, let the child grow up and be whatever the hell it is." And earlier this year, he added that Mabel's birth has made him reevaluate gender identity. He said: "Now that I have these very important women in

my life I have re-evaluated the way that I unconsciously looked at gender, because now I've got a daughter I think 'wow, I don't necessarily need to dress her in clothes that are indicative of her gender'. "Why would you? I've become quite sensitive to that and aware of it. "I think you have to evolve because it's quite an abrupt and sudden change, one minute you don't have a baby and then suddenly there is a new relative who lives in your house, not a moderate or minor relative like an uncle, a full-on person who is dependent on you. "When I first saw my daughter I felt like some latent part of myself got switched on in that moment, something to do with my own femininity and fathomless love that I had previously speculated upon but not accessed."



Mel C wants to star in another musical



The former Spice Girls singer has previously tread the boards in both 'Blood Brothers' and 'Jesus Christ Superstar' and though she's busy with her music at the moment, she'd like to get back on stage at some point. She said: "I released an album a year ago so we did some live shows. And I am just about to start work on another [record]. "[Would I do theatre again?] Quite possibly yeah. Musical theatre is a big love of mine. Hope there is some more in the future but I am concentrating on my music at the moment." While the 43-year-old singer may have shunned attempts to get the Spice Girls back together for their 20th anniversary, she insists the door isn't completely closed on a reunion in the future. She told BANG Showbiz: "It might happen one day. There are no plans at the moment but who knows." Mel recently admitted to feeling money-related pressures once she found fame and fortune as part of the Spice Girls. In particular, she felt guilty about her own success having been raised in a household in which "money was tight". The singer, who was known as Sporty Spice during her time with the chart-topping girl group, told 'In Conversation With': "I was so young and it's a huge responsibility. "It's not about money. It's about feeling like you have to take care of all of these people. And you just feel like you want to be taking care of yourself."

Adele offered £20m for a year-long residency Vegas

Bosses at The Wynn hotel are reportedly so keen to sign the star up that they have offered her £380,000 per show. A source told The Sunday: "The days of entertainers coming to retire at Vegas are a thing of the past. "In the last few years, we have seen massive stars performing on the strip and every major hotel wants to say they have the biggest star as their resident. Caesars Palace had Mariah Carey, Planet Hollywood has Britney Spears, and we want Adele. "Even at half a million dollars a show we are confident we would make a healthy return." Although Adele was forced to cancel one of her Wembley dates during the summer after damaging her vocal cords, Wynn bosses are not concerned

about Adele potentially having to cancel any of her Vegas shows. The insider explained: "Adele is a professional, and knows her own ability. And we are happy to be flexible in negotiations if it's needed in order to bring her on board." Meanwhile, Adele revealed during her 'Adele Live' tour in March that she was planning to take an extended break from touring in order to focus on having another baby. She said at the time: "I'll see ya later, I'll see ya on the other side. In a couple of years when I'll be back, you won't be able to get rid of me. I'm going to go and have a baby." The 29-year-old singer already has four-year-old son Angelo with her husband Simon Konecki.



Niall Horan isn't ready for kids

Although the 24-year-old singer's One Direction bandmates Louis Tomlinson and Liam Payne each have a son, Niall insisted he is not broody just yet. Speaking to The Sun on Sunday's Fabulous magazine, he said: "Some people are like that - some people want kids. Louis loves kids. He's got, like, seven brothers and sisters or something and he's brilliant with them, so that was a no-brainer. "Same with Payno - he's always loved kids. So do I, but I don't particularly want one right now. I'm fine where I am." And Niall, who has been linked to Selena Gomez, Ellie Goulding, Lily Collins and

Olympia Valance also insisted he doesn't have time for love. When asked if he has ever been in love, the star - who has just released his debut solo album 'Flicker' - said: "Yeah. What I think love is anyway. Well, if you listen to this album you'd think so, yeah. But not right now. I think I'm all right where I am. "I doubt there would be time now I'm going on tour. I don't know. I'm not gonna say no: if it happens it happens. I'm only 24, so I don't really need to worry about stuff like that at the minute." Meanwhile, Niall insisted One Direction - who are currently on hiatus - will get back together in the future. He said: "I wouldn't stick a date on it, but it's a no-brainer really, isn't it? We'd be stupid not to. "I can see it, definitely. I think we all can. It's the most rewarding thing we've ever done, the biggest part of our lives, so we'd be silly not going back to it, especially with the way we finished it. To come back potentially to that again would just be great craic."

Delevingne became a model to escape her issues

The 25-year-old model-turned-actress believes that her career as a model provided her with a way of avoiding her problems but acting has forced her to deal with them. She told Australia's Stellar magazine: "Modelling came at a time in my life where I wanted to please people. "I was just doing things to run away from my own problems. I wasn't dealing with things that were going on emotionally. That's why I ended up being unhappy. "Being an actor helped me reflect on my own emotions, be able to express them more, be in the moment." Meanwhile, Cara recently spoke out about disgraced movie producer Harvey Weinstein, revealing that she was left "powerless and scared" after a terrifying encounter. In a lengthy post on Instagram, Cara wrote: "When I first started to work as an actress, I was working on a film and I received a call from Harvey



Weinstein asking if I had slept with any of the women I was seen with in the media. It was a very odd and uncomfortable call...i answered none of his questions and hurried off the phone but before I hung up, he said to me that if I was gay or decided to be with a woman especially in public that I'd never get the role of a straight woman or make it as an actress in Hollywood. "A year or two later, I went to a meeting with him in the lobby of a hotel with a director about an upcoming film. The director left the meeting and Harvey asked me to stay and chat with him. As soon as we were alone he began to brag about all the actresses he had slept with and how he had made their careers and spoke about other inappropriate things of a sexual nature."
