The 43-year-old actress lost more than \$173,000 worth of stock after a cabinet, stashed with lavish watches and sparkly necklaces, in her temporary shop in New York was broken into but her mother Blythe Danner, 72, said Gwyneth was trying to look on the bright side. Blythe told the New York Post's Page Six: "I called her immediately. And she said, 'Oh, Mom, it's OK. It's good publicity.'
