



Iguazu Falls

Iguazu Falls are waterfalls of the Iguazu River on the border of the Argentine province of Misiones and the Brazilian state of Parana. The falls divide the river into the upper and lower Iguazu. The Iguazu River rises near the city of Curitiba. For most of its course, the river flows through Brazil, however, most of the falls are on the Argentine side. Below its confluence with the

kilometre-long edge divide the falls into many separate waterfalls and cataracts, varying between 60 to 82 meters high. The number of these smaller waterfalls fluctuates from 150 to 300, depending on the water level. Approximately half of the river's flow falls into a long and narrow chasm called the Devil's Throat. The Devil's Throat is U-shaped, 82

a canyon that drains into the Parana River, a short distance downstream from the Itaipu Dam. The junction of the water flows marks the border between Brazil, Argentina, and Paraguay. There are points in the cities of Foz do Iguazu, Brazil, Puerto Iguazu, Argentina, and Ciudad del Este, Paraguay, which have access to the Iguazu River, where the borders of all three nations may be seen, a popular tourist attraction for visitors to the three cities.

Distribution of the falls between Argentina and Brazil

The Iguazu Falls are arranged in a way that resembles a reversed letter "J". The border between Brazil and Argentina runs through the Devil's Throat. On the right bank is the Brazilian territory, which has just over 20% of the jumps of these falls, and the left side jumps are Argentine, which make up almost 80% of the falls.

Climate

Iguazu Falls experiences a humid subtropical climate with abundant precipitation and high temperatures year-round. During the summer of 2006, a severe drought caused the Iguazu River to become diminished, reducing the amount of water flowing over the falls to 300 cubic meters per second until early December. This was unusual, as dry periods normally last only a few weeks.



San Antonio River, the Iguazu River forms the boundary between Argentina and Brazil.

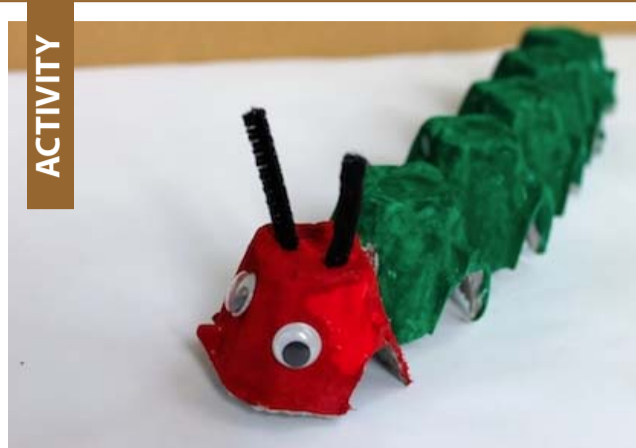
Geography

Iguazu Falls are located where the Iguazu River tumbles over the edge of the Parana Plateau, 23 kilometers upriver from the Iguazu's confluence with the Parana River. Numerous islands along the 2.7-

meters high, 150 m wide, and 700 m long. Place names have been given also to many other smaller falls, such as San Martin Falls, Bossetti Falls, and many others.

About 900 meters of the 2.7-kilometre length does not have water flowing over it.

The edge of the basalt cap recedes by 3 mm per year. The water of the lower Iguazu collects in



Egg carton Very Hungry Caterpillar

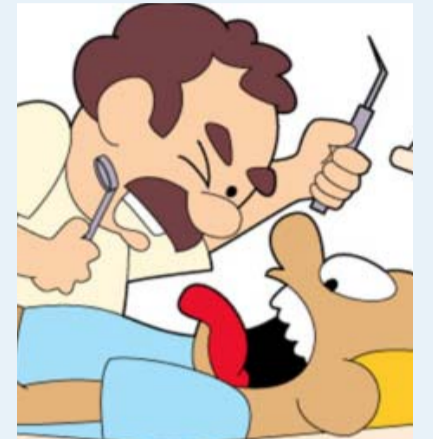
- What you need:**

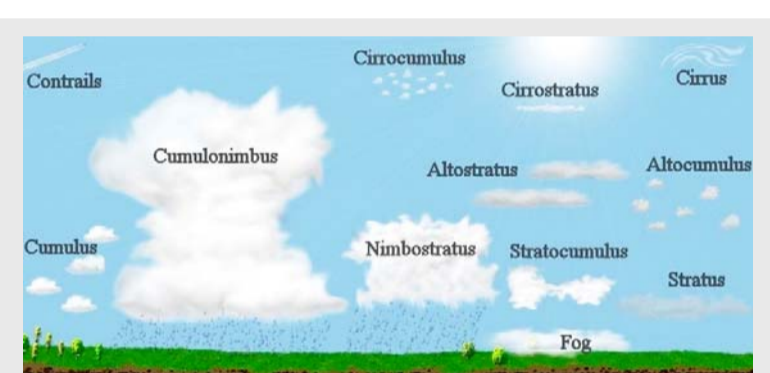

CLOUD FACTS

- A cloud is a large group of tiny water droplets that we can see in the air.
- Clouds are formed when water on Earth evaporates into the sky and condenses high up in the cooler air. Learn more about the water cycle.

KIDS RECIPE

PIZZADILLAS WITH RED SAUCE

What you need:

- * 1 cup quinoa
- * 2 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- * 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- * 2 tablespoons vinegar
- * 1 teaspoon fresh chopped garlic
- * 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil
- * 1 teaspoon salt
- * 1/4 teaspoon white pepper
- * 1/2 cup chopped sweet red pepper
- * 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- * 1/4 cup chopped green onion
- * 2 tablespoons chopped red onion
- * 1/2 cup halved cherry tomatoes
- * 2 tablespoons sliced black olives
- * 1 tablespoon feta cheese, crumbled

What to do:

1. Place quinoa in strainer. Rinse under running water.
2. Put quinoa and chicken broth in saucepan over high heat.
3. Bring quinoa to a boil. Cover and reduce to a simmer.
4. Cook quinoa for 10-15 minutes or until all liquid is absorbed. Set aside to cool.
5. In a small bowl, combine lemon juice, vinegar, garlic, oil, salt, and white pepper. Set aside.
6. Combine red pepper, parsley, green and red onions, tomatoes, and olives in a bowl. Stir in cooled quinoa, feta, and dressing.
7. Serve at room temperature or chilled.
