KUWAIT SHOOTERS SHINE AT AMIR GRAND PRIX

KUWAIT: Kuwait's Women Trap shooter Shahad Al-Hawal won the first gold medal for Kuwait yesterday - followed by Sara Al-Hawal who won silver, while Egypt's Suzan Gaber took the bronze. In the Men's Trap, Kuwait's Abdelrahman Al-Faihan was up to the task - winning the gold medal in a hard fought competition. Lebanon's Walid Alnajjar won silver while Kuwait's Talal Al-Rashidi won bronze. Today, there will be a gold medal up for grab in the Women's Skeet event, while men's official PET will also take place today.

Meanwhile, Presidents of the Arab Shooting Federations thanked HH the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah for his unlimited support in shooting sport, which helped raise its status at the world level. He said this during the Ordinary General Assembly meeting that was chaired by President of Arab and Kuwait Shooting Federations Eng Duaij Khalaf Al-Otaibi. The Arab Shooting Sport leaders appreciated the major role Kuwait is playing to boost the sport in the Arab world.
