The 40-year-old retired soccer star - who has children Brooklyn 17, Romeo, 13, Cruz, 11, and Harper, four, with wife Victoria - already has 40 inkings on his body and admits he still has plans to add to the artwork because it makes him happy. He said: "The tattoos are a way of me expressing deeper feelings, about the things I care about and love. Am I done? Probably not. "[I] think Victoria's given up on telling me to stop now. She used to. She used to say, 'Do you have to?' But she knows it makes me happy." David is known for his sense of style and admits he has always enjoyed dressing up and "looking smart", even from a very young age, and is thankful to have succeeded in a profession that allowed him to earn enough to buy "nice" things. The 47-year-old British actress admitted that she and her red-headed Australian pal have shared a long standing intercontinental "history" - despite their busy schedules prohibiting frequent meet ups - because when they do catch up they discuss everything in one full blast. Mayim Bialik thinks actors are 'overpaid'

The 'Big Bang Theory' star believes her and her co-stars get paid too much but doesn't think the high pay figures make the quality of the show any better as its success is down to the talent of the "extraordinary cast and amazing writing staff". She told the New York Daily News' Confidenti@l column: "I don't make as much money as people think I do. I don't think about the money a lot. I am an employed actor and we are all overpaid. I am grateful to be employed. But I still need to think about what is next and I think about it a lot. "I don't think the pay has anything to do with the quality of the show. We have an extraordinary cast and amazing writing staff and people all care passionately about putting on a show every week." Meanwhile, it was previously reported that the three main stars - Jim Parsons, Johnny Galecki and Kaley Cuoco - of the popular television show receive \$1 million each per episode. A source said at the time: "[They will get] larger pieces of the show, signing bonuses, production deals and advances towards the back-end." The stars of the show dominated Forbes' Highest-Earning TV Actors list last year. Jim came out on top with \$29 million and was followed closely behind by Johnny with \$27 million. Simon Helberg and Kunal Nayya also came joint third.
