### IRAN URGES GULF TO 'SEIZE OPPORTUNITY' OF ROUHANI'S VISIT

DUBAI: A top Iranian official called on the Gulf states yesterday to seize the opportunity of a visit by Iranian President Hassan Rouhani to Kuwait and Oman to improve ties, warning that a chance like this would "pass like a cloud". Rouhani will visit Oman and Kuwait today amid efforts by Kuwait to mend relations between the Gulf states and Tehran. The six Arab members of Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), especially Saudi Arabia, accuse Iran of using sectarianism to interfere in Arab countries and build its own sphere of influence in the Middle East. Iran denies the accusations.

The Iranian president will meet Oman's Sultan Qaboos in Muscat today before travelling on to Kuwait on the invitation of HH the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, Rouhani's deputy chief of staff for communications, Parviz Esmaeili, was quoted as saying on Monday by state-run Press TV. Iran's ambassador to Kuwait Alireza Enayati was quoted by ISNA news agency as saying that "on this one-day visit, regional issues as well as bilateral cooperation will be discussed".

"Rouhani's regional initiative to accept invitation of leaders of Oman and Kuwait signals the need for Islamic friendship and restoration of regional ties," Hamid Aboutalebi, the Iranian president's deputy chief of staff, tweeted yesterday.

KUWAIT: The National Assembly's regular session yesterday witnessed a number of arguments which took up most of the Assembly's time, preventing it from debating the sensitive issues of Khor Abdullah and the bank deposits scandal. MPs rejected a motion to extend the session beyond the normal finish time at 1400 hours, and as a result, most of the issues were moved for today.

During the session, MP Ahmad Al-Fadhli clashed several times with opposition MPs over two requests from the public prosecution to lift his immunity to be tried in two cases. He was involved in a heated argument with MPs Jamaan Al-Harbash and Mohammad Hayef and others for calling to close down a religious center in Salmiya for allegedly sowing discord and sectarian strife.

### TEACHER DIAGNOSED WITH TUBERCULOSIS

KUWAIT: A female Kuwaiti teacher in Ahmadi has been diagnosed with pulmonary tuberculosis (TB), the Ministry of Health announced yesterday. In a statement, the ministry noted that all those who may have come in contact with the patient will undergo medical tests to prevent the spread of the disease. Moreover, the statement noted that 68 students and 18 teachers have been examined, with no one testing positive for the disease, adding that all precautionary steps will be taken to protect the health and safety of people. — KUNA
