KUWAIT OFFERS TREATMENT TO SYRIAN REFUGEES IN TURKEY

ANKARA: Kuwait's Patient helping Fund medical team has begun delivering medical assistance to injured Syrian refugees in Reyhanli town in Hatay province south of Turkey. Member of the team and general surgeon Dr. Abdulaziz Al-Musalem said yesterday the team has visited 20 quadriplegic and paraplegic patients who have spine injuries due to fire shooting. The team will conduct

urgent surgeries to those who urgently need it and offer thorough diagnosis in order to prescribe the right medical help.

Al-Musalem said that Kuwait has always been pioneering to offer humanitarian assistance, hence, voluntary work has been encouraged at government and individual levels. On his part, director of Reyhanli medical center Dr. Osama Ghali said that the

center receives nearly 300 Syrian refugees on a daily basis. Reyhanli is a town and district of Hatay Province, on the Mediterranean coast of Turkey, near the country's border with Syria. Its Turkish population is only 90,000 while the Syrian refugees' population amounts to 130,000. The Turkish government allows 20 injured Syrians to enter its border crossing Bab Al-Hawa to receive medical treatment.—KUNA
