



PALESTINIANS REBUILD MOSQUE IN GAZA WITH KUWAITI DONATION

GAZA: The Palestinian Al-Falah Charity re-inaugurated, with contributions from an anonymous Kuwaiti donor, yesterday Omar Abdul Aziz Mosque in Al-Sudaniya in northern Gaza after it had undergone renovation. The mosque had been virtually demolished in Israeli attacks. Ramadan Tanboura, the head of the society, expressed in a statement deep gratitude to the Kuwaiti donor who helped rebuild the war-destroyed mosque, noting the close ties between the Kuwaiti and Palestinian peoples.

The Palestinian association, several months ago, opened another mosque, also with financial contributions by Kuwaiti donors, he revealed. He expressed deep gratitude to Kuwait, namely the leadership and the people, for the continuing support for the Palestinian people.

Hassan Al-Saifi, Undersecretary of the Palestinian Ministry of Religious Affairs, affirmed that the mosque was re-constructed with money granted by a Kuwaiti citizen. Palestinians who performed the Friday prayers at the mosque expressed gratitude to the Kuwaiti donor and the society. — KUNA
