



Davies and O'Riordan had planned collaboration

Dave Davies and Dolores O'Riordan had planned to collaborate on music together before she died. The Kinks guitarist was close friends with the late Cranberries star and he revealed they had discussed working together on a song called 'Home' before she passed away after drowning in the bath of a London hotel due to accidental alcohol intoxication in January. Writing in *The Guardian*, he said: "We had a mutual respect. We talked about writing together - I had an idea for a song called 'Home', about being home again, and she understood what I was trying to say. But we never sat down to do it, and that makes me really sad. She was very kind to me, too. We said we'd meet when she was next in London, and that was that." Dave also praised Dolores' "unique" voice and said he admired her talent from the first time he heard her

sing. He said: "Dolores hadn't had a great time in her life. But the music that came out of her despite everything was incredible. I remember first hearing 'Zombie' in the 1990s - that was the first time I was aware of her. Her voice caught me straight away. The way it went from this beautiful, soft whisper with this real Celtic vibe, to this huge rock voice, was fabulous, really unique. She didn't get enough credit for that." The Cranberries formed in the early 90s and their first big hit single 'Linger' - taken from their debut LP 'Everybody Else Is Doing It, So Why Can't We?' - brought them to the attention of British, American and European audiences in 1993. The band's second album 'No Need To Argue' was released in 1994 and became a global smash, containing the singles 'Zombie', 'I Can't Be With You' and 'Ode To My Family'.

Longoria praises L'Oreal for championing women

Eva Longoria has praised L'Oreal for championing women and their "struggle" for power. The 43-year-old star - who is an ambassador for L'Oreal Paris - has opened up about the difficulties, and said the huge brand is helping with its 'You're worth it' slogan. Speaking at the company's annual Women of Worth Awards, Eva said: "We're finding our voices and our power every day, and there's a struggle to do that in every industry-not just Hollywood, in every industry-so to see a big company like L'Oreal doing the

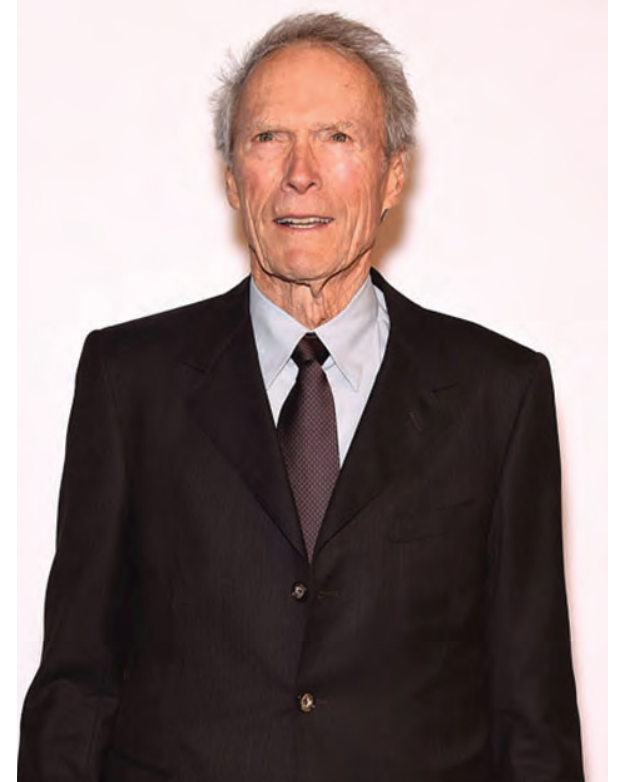

Meanwhile, the proud mum gave birth to her first child - son Santiago - with her husband Jose 'Pepe' Baston in June, and she hasn't felt any outside pressure to get her pre-baby body back. She told *Extra*: "Well, I don't really succumb to any pressures outside of myself, but I really gave my body time to heal and just embrace... 'I was breastfeeding and just enjoying postpartum and basking in his energy and this beautiful life I created, and so I was very forgiving to my body because it created a human! 'It's just now I'm starting to get back to working out and dieting... but not even hardcore, just like, you know what? Let's start... let's start to do some movements, see what happens.'" The 'Desperate Housewives' star recently revealed she is on a "very serious" weight training program and being more careful with her diet, but she's happy she didn't rush getting back into exercise and gave her body the time it needed to recover. She said: "I still love yoga, but my workouts now are more weight training. Very serious weight training. 'I really gave my body time to adjust to postpartum and post-pregnancy. You know, it had a baby! It created a human life, so I really wasn't too hard about getting back into shape. 'Now I'm working out a lot more and watching what I eat. I'm barely starting to get back into it."



Toby Keith inspired by Clint Eastwood

Toby Keith's 'Don't Let the Old Man In' was inspired by Clint Eastwood. The singer/songwriter revealed he was inspired by a conversation with the 88-year-old actor/director about his latest movie 'The Mule' and his work ethic. Toby explained he asked Clint how he kept working at his age, explaining: "He said, 'I just get up every morning and go out. And I don't let the old man in'. And I thought, 'I'm writing that.'" Admitted he became obsessed with the song, Toby said: "People were talking to me and they would say, 'Did you hear what I just said?' And I was like, 'No,' because I wasn't listening to any conversations. I was consumed by 'Don't Let the Old Man In.' I worked so hard on it. When I finally sang the line, I thought, it's got to be dark, it's got to be a ballad and it's got to be sim-

ple." Toby was unwell the day he recorded the track but he believes his illness helped to make the song sound even better. He explained to *Billboard*: "I was sick as a dog that day. I was coughing and sneezing and thinking, this is terrible. I gave it the best vocal I could that day, and I sent it off. It's a real raspy, sleepy, tired, sick vocal. I said, 'Well now you've got a reference, and I'll go back and put a vocal on it for you.'" However, Clint loved the song and the recording and immediately asked if he would include it in his movie. Toby said: "He said, 'I've got a spot in the movie and I'm putting it in there.' And then Warner Bros. called asking did I read the script before I wrote this song because it fits perfectly. He wanted it sick and tired and dark like that."



Walliams was 'starstruck' by Aniston

David Walliams was "so starstruck" by his 'Murder Mystery' co-star Jennifer Aniston. The 47-year-old comic stars opposite the former 'Friends' actress in the upcoming Netflix film and admitted he initially had no idea what to say to the "charming and lovely" star. Speaking to *Heat* magazine, he said: "She is a dream. I was so starstruck because she's so, so famous. 'Oh my God, it's Jennifer Aniston. What do I say to her?' But she's so charming and lovely." And the 'Britain's Got Talent' star's friends were hoping to see a romance develop between the pair but he doesn't think he could ever compare to the 'Dumplin'' actress' ex-husbands. David - who has son Alfred, five, with ex-wife Lara Stone - said: "Some of my friends were saying, 'You should go out with her' but I think it would be a bit of a comedown from Brad Pitt and Justin Theroux. I wouldn't wish that on her." The movie also stars Adam Sandler and David praised the actor for creating such a positive atmosphere on the set. He said: "I don't think I've ever had a happier experience on a job. 'Adam Sandler is hilarious and he's constantly improvising, making you laugh, playing funny music and dancing on set. 'It sounds like it might be annoying but it's not. 'He just wants to create a happy

atmosphere, so everyone is relaxed and can do their best. 'It was like he was hosting a party that we were all attending.' The A-list cast also led the former 'Little Britain' funnyman to a bizarre encounter with Cher while they were in Italy. He explained: "One night I'm at dinner with Jen and Adam and oh, there's Cher at the table next to us. 'She was with this jeweler called Loree Rodkin, who I know through Elton John. So Loree introduced me to Cher and said, 'Cher, this is David, he's a friend of Elton's...' 'And Cher replied, 'Thank you very much'. I didn't know where to go with that."



Benicio del Toro to star in Dora the Explorer

Benicio del Toro is set to play a villain in 'Dora the Explorer'. The 51-year-old actor will voice the character of Swiper, the thieving fox, in the upcoming live action adaptation of the Nickelodeon TV series. According to *The Hollywood Reporter*, Benicio will join alongside Isabela Moner, who will play the titular character, Michael Pena, as her father Cole 'Papi' Marquez and Eva Longoria, as her mother Elena 'Mami' Marquez. 'Dora the Explorer' will see the youngster's parents in danger as she leads her cousin Diego, her monkey friend Boots, and a group of teens "on a Goonies-esque adventure to save her parents and solve the impossible mystery behind a lost Inca civilization." 'Dora the Explorer' is a children's television show which first aired in 2000 and is based around the adventures of the titular Spanish-speaking girl, her monkey Boots, her backpack and other animated friends. In each episode, Dora goes on an adventure in an animated world set inside a computer and asks for viewers' help in solving a puzzle or mystery she faced, teaching children both basic Spanish and puzzle solving skills. Michael Bay's Platinum Dunes label and his partners Andrew Form and Brad Fuller were initially attached to produce but they are no longer involved. James Bobin will direct the film from a script penned by Danielle Sanchez-Wittel and Nicholas Stoller. Although the TV series focused on a young Dora, the live-action movie will center around the titular character as a teenager who moves to the city to live with her cousin Diego, who also had his own spin-off show 'Go Diego Go'. Paramount Pictures are looking to distribute the movie, as the studio is devoted to creating films from the Viacom brands including Nickelodeon - on which 'Dora the Explorer' aired - MTV, Comedy Central and BET. 'Dora the Explorer' ran for 14 years and was geared towards the younger viewers, with the franchise also branching out into dolls and video games. 'Dora the Explorer' is set to hit cinema screens in 2019.

Timothee Chalamet had to stop losing weight during Beautiful Boy

Timothee Chalamet had to be told to stop losing weight for his role in 'Beautiful Boy'. The 22-year-old actor plays drug addict Nic Sheff in the biopic and shed 20lbs for scenes when his alter ego hit his lowest point but movie bosses were worried he was "pushing" himself further than he needed to. Explaining the weight loss scenes were shot first to allow the actor to return to his regular size for the happier moments, director Felix Van Groeningen told *Total Film*: "It helped him physically feel it and

hit some sort of rock bottom. 'I mean, he was very closely followed but at some point, we had a feeling he was pushing it further than we wanted, because he was so committed to it. 'We did have to say at some point, 'Timmy, stop. It's great. We don't want you to go into a dangerous place.' 'Timothee stars opposite Steve Carrell as his on-screen father in the movie and they struck up a bond instantly. Steve said: 'We just naturally became friends. There weren't any exercises that we needed to go through in order to generate that affection. I think we had it almost instantly.' Timothee agreed: 'Yeah, I feel the same way. I felt very... just taken in. 'I felt a strong warmth from Steve and from Felix, our director, and then the scenes with Amy Ryan and Maura Tierney as well. 'I felt a very paternal quality coming from them.' While Steve had already been cast before his screen son, the 'Call Me By Your Name' actor wowed the director with his audition tape. Felix said: 'We did auditions and saw a lot of tapes coming in. And at some point we saw an audition of a young actor, not very well-known - Timothee Chalamet. 'You know, he blew us away with his bold and fearless energy and how he could switch between a person completely strung out on drugs and also be this very intriguing teenager trying to find a bond with his dad. 'So at some point, we put them in the room together to do a chemistry read and I just felt it - they connected.'
