The retreat features a Brutalist-type concrete spiral staircase, connecting all three levels. Designed by Mexico City practice, Productora, the building is wrapped by timber pergolas, protecting the interior from the sun. In the event of hurricane, the terraces also have a folding mechanism that transforms it into a closed box in order to protect it.

Anyone staying there will have a sustainable visit, as the villa is fully powered by solar and wind energy. Also, by raising the house on cross-shaped columns, the impact on the environment is reduced. However, a stay at the hotel won't come cheap.
