DUKE AND DUCHESS OF SUSSEX HELD SECRET MEETING WITH HOLLAND AND ZENDAYA



The Duke and Duchess of Sussex held a secret meeting with Spider-Man stars Tom Holland and Zendaya. Harry and Meghan were said to be keen to get some stardust from the couple, who were reportedly "bemused" by the request of the Duke and Duchess - who stepped down as senior members of the British royal family and relocated to the US in 2020. A friend of Harry's told the Daily Mail's Eden Confidential column: "Tom and Zendaya were rather bemused. "Tom had never met Harry or spoken to him in his life, so didn't know what they wanted." Despite this, Harry, 37, and Meghan, 40, were able to meet with the Hollywood stars in secrecy as they look to expand their famous contacts in California. The source added: "The meeting took place." Meanwhile, Harry - who shares children Archie, two, and Lilibet, seven months with Meghan - will team up with

tennis legend Serena Williams for an event next month. The Duke will be in his role as Chief Impact Officer for professional coaching and mental health organization BetterUp when he teams up with the tennis ace and the company's CEO Alexi Robichaux for a conversation about "cultivating the power of mental fitness through a bold commitment to Inner Work on 3 February. The discussion will form part of the company's virtual Inner Work Day and will see the trio share "personal stories" about their own experiences. An agenda for the event stated: "From creating companies and foundations designed to inspire others to achieve their best to tackling challenges and finding success both in and outside of work, Serena, Prince Harry and Alexi share their personal stories and unique perspectives."

Emma Raducanu has been targeted by a stalker

The 19-year-old tennis star says she has been scared to go out alone after Amrit Magar tracked down her address and visited her home in London on three occasions, leaving bizarre notes and gifts. Magar also stole Emma's father's trainer after mistakenly



believing that it belonged to the sports star. The Daily Mail newspaper reports that Magar, 35, was convicted of stalking at Bromley Magistrates Court and will be sentenced next month. Speaking to police as she prepared for the Australian Open in Melbourne, Emma said: "Because of this I feel like my freedom has been taken away from me. I am constantly looking over my shoulder. "I feel on edge and worried this could happen again. I don't feel safe in my own home which is where I should feel safest." The married Magar is said to have become interested in the US Open champion after watching her on television and turned up at the house in November with a bizarre love note. He also visited the following month where he hung Christmas lights and decorations on a tree outside the family home where he was pursued by Emma's father Ian - who had recognized him from doorbell camera footage. In a statement, he said: "I received a notification on my phone from the Nest doorbell. It said someone was at the front of the house. "I went outside and could see a male stood on the pavement. He began running away." Emma also revealed that she was worried about the public finding out that she had a stalker and wanted to move to a new property. She said: "I want to move to a new house with better security because I am worried he might come back as he knows where my home is."

Kidman says Urban is 'the best thing' to happen to her

Nicole Kidman thinks Keith Urban is the "best thing" to ever happen to her. The Oscar-winning actress - who has Sunday, 13, and Faith, 11, with Keith - has been married to the musician since 2006, and she believes he's transformed her life. She shared: "I met him later in life and it's been the best thing that's ever happened to me. That man is the best thing that's ever happened to me." Nicole, 54, was married to actor Tom Cruise between 1990 and 2001, and has kids Isabella, 29, and Connor, 27, with the Hollywood star. However, Nicole believes she's found the perfect match in Keith, 54. She told 'CBS Mornings': "We're a mix. We're very suited [for each other]. I'm



incredibly lucky to have met him." Nicole recently revealed that she wants to "share" her success with her family. The acclaimed actress appreciates the support she gets from her family, and she hopes that her youngest daughters are learning from her example. Nicole shared: "I think they see it. They're firsthand, where we travel as a little group, where, always, we share pretty much everything. "I always say it's our work as a family, it's not my work. So they share in everything, all of them, because it is our work and without their support, I wouldn't be able to do it." Nicole also heaped praise on her husband, describing Keith as "rock solid". She said: "[Her daughters are] right there with me and we have a very, deeply, intimate family, so we share a lot. "They're both seen a lot and been aware of a lot of my goals. And my husband is, I've always said, he is rock solid. And he'll be there, like just an incredible love and support to me, as I hope I give to him as well, because he's got a massive career and it's just in a very different field."

Beyonce brings out Ivy Park collection in time for Valentine's Day

Beyonce has revealed the capsule Ivy Park collection for Valentine's Day. The 'Feeling Myself' hitmaker will be dropping 'Ivy Heart' - the sixth collection between the former Destiny's Child member and Adidas - on February 9 online and in stores February 10 just in time for love's big day. Snippets of the gender-neutral line - mainly in different hues of red - have been published online showing some of the wares being modeled by pop superstar Troye Sivan, model and actor Tyson Beckford and models Shu Pei, Karrueche Tran and the comedian Naomi Watanabe. The range of accessories, shoes and clothes - which includes a latex baseball cap (\$40), a heart-lip bag (\$90) and a latex parka jacket (\$250) - caters for all budgets with prices going from \$30 to \$300. The latest offering from the global singing superstar was her Christmas collection - titled 'Halls of Ivy' - aimed at both adults and children and sought to bring people together regardless of background, race or beliefs while honoring individuality. The campaign included many offspring of famous faces, such as Reese Witherspoon and Ryan Phillippe's two children, 22-year-old Ava and 18-year-old Deacon, the daughter of the Vanessa and the late Kobe Bryant, 18-year-old Natalia and Beyonce's own daughters, Blue Ivy, 10, and Rumi, four, who she shares with her husband, rapper Jay-Z, 52, along with their son Sir, also four. Beyonce's first collection with Adidas debuted in 2020 with the line selling out in mere minutes. From 2016 to 2019, the 'Dreamgirls' star worked under the brand Topshop - which has since cut its retail operation - before buying out the brand completely.



Halle Berry thinks she's always having to 'prove' herself



The Oscar-winning actress is one of the best-known stars in Hollywood, but Halle still feels like she needs to keep proving herself. In a clip from ABC's 'Screen Queens Rising' - which has been shared with People - the actress says: "I feel like I'm someone who is always asked to prove themselves, over and over and over and over again. I'm always having to prove." Halle, 55, believes she's faced constant obstacles during her time in the movie business. The acclaimed actress says: "The fight has been consistent. Obstacle after obstacle, fight every single day." In December, meanwhile, Halle revealed she set her Razzie Award "on fire". The movie star won the Worst Actress gong at the parody awards ceremony for her performance in 'Catwoman' - which was released in 2004 - and Halle explained what she did with her Razzie. She said: "I went to the Razzie [Awards] because I feel like we all take ourselves so seriously. "If we get an award, if we get the Oscar, we somehow are made to feel like we're somehow better than everybody else, but we're really not. You were just chosen that year by your peers, and you were acknowledged for doing what they considered stellar work ... If you find yourself face to face with a Razzie, does that mean you're the worst actor there ever was? Probably not. "You just got the p*** taken out on you that year by a group of people that can." Halle won the Academy Award for Best Actress for her performance in 'Monster's Ball'. And she compared that experience to being handed a Razzie. She said: "If I can show up to collect an Oscar when you're honoring me, I can certainly show up to collect a Razzie when you say, good try, but do better."

Gervais felt 'sense of responsibility' to avoid one 'After Life' ending

Ricky Gervais felt a "sense of responsibility" about the ending of 'After Life'. The 60-year-old star admitted he considered a number of different last scenes for the third series of his Netflix comedy drama but quickly rejected the "most drastic" idea of having his character Tony take his own life after a grief counselor urged him not to. He said: "It was down to two or three [endings]. Some options were worse and sadder than others but I soon rejected the most drastic of those, and I'll tell you why. "After the first season, I'd never had a reaction like it - that emotional response from people - and I realized that everyone's grieving, really. "And I met a grief therapist who said, "Please don't have Tony commit suicide." "Now, I've always insisted on not worrying about what other people might think, but I had to take that on board. "So - amazingly - I felt a sense of responsibility and I ruled that out. "Then, it was a matter of degrees. What happened? What does Tony do? What does it really mean? "I didn't want it to be ambiguous and it's not really open. It's the end. "And we don't know what happens next, except that everyone dies eventually. So that was my thinking behind it." The final scene was soundtracked by Joni Mitchell's 'Both Sides Now' but Ricky also had a different song in mind for the closing moments. He said: "Imagine if I hadn't been able to use that song - how it would have affected the scene." Asked if he'd considered something else, he told heat magazine: "Shall I say, or would that annoy people? Does that spoil it? It's fine. "It was 'Heroes' [by David Bowie]. "But the music is so important, I knew the songs I wanted for the whole series as I was writing the script. They're that embedded in it. "So I basically picked my favorite songs from the last 50 years."



Tucci's sense of taste is 'stronger than ever'

Stanley Tucci's sense of taste and smell are stronger than ever following his cancer treatment. The 61-year-old actor received treatment after a tumor was found at the base of his tongue, causing him to lose his sense of taste and smell - but he's revealed they're both now stronger than ever before. He shared: "I got very lucky. I can taste and eat almost everything now. In fact, my sense of taste and smell are almost heightened and more than they were before, oddly enough." Now, the Hollywood star has a greater appreciation for food than ever, too. He told the 'Today' show: "When you're forced to go without something that you love - just like when you're forced to go without someone that you love - you appreciate them, and or it, much more when you're able to have it

back or if you're lucky enough to have it back." Stanley is a lifelong food lover and he's even published two cookbooks of his own. The actor also hosts 'Stanley Tucci: Searching for Italy' and he can't wait for the show to return for a second season later this year. He said: "Food means everything to me. It's sort of all I can think about." The movie star also revealed how he first came to host the acclaimed series on CNN. Stanley - whose film credits include 'Road to Perdition' and 'The Devil Wears Prada' - explained: "CNN came to me and asked me to do this series a few years ago, and we've been able to make it happen. It's been a lifelong dream of mine to explore the regional cooking of it in as much detail as possible." - Bang Showbiz



Monica Galetti offers tips for Queen Elizabeth pudding competition

Monica Galetti has warned entrants wanting to create a pudding for Queen Elizabeth not to make anything "too crazy". The 'Masterchef: The Professionals' star will be among the judges for the Platinum Pudding Competition - which asks amateur cooks to invent a dessert in honor of the monarch's 70 years on the throne - and she's suggested hopefuls "jazz up" the queen's known favorites. She said: "From what I've heard about Her Majesty, she doesn't like over-complicated things. She likes traditional, but apparently she has a fondness of chocolate and berries, especially seasonal fruit. "There's a bit of scope to maybe mix the two, then see how they can jazz it up. "There's nothing wrong with taking a traditional pudding and bringing your own personality to it - but don't make it too crazy." The winning recipe will be served at the Big Jubilee Lunch and given to the queen, and though it's not yet been revealed if the successful entrant will meet the monarch, Monica hopes they do - so she can tag along. She told Britain's HELLO! magazine: "Wouldn't that be a wonderful prize - to meet the queen and present her with the wonderful pudding? "The rest of us could tag along and stand behind the winner, saying, 'We helped select it.'" The 46-year-old chef previously met the queen at a 2018 Buckingham Palace reception. She said: "She was probably wouldn't remember me. "She was so witty and charming and I was so honored to be in line to shake her hand."
